For a score endeavoring to capture the bite of cold winds, I have to say this was one of the warmest experiences I've ever had. These musicians are this score and I am deeply indebted to them all. Special mention must be made of Taylor Davis, whose violin solos sit at the emotional heart of The Banner Saga.

Finally, a special word of thanks to the legendary Jerry F. Junkin, and his partner in crime at the Dallas Winds, Kim Campbell. Recording with this ensemble was a career highlight, and it never would have happened were it not for their inventiveness, creativity and all-out enthusiasm.

In short, I'm just a big pile of gratitude. Every project is inevitably the product of a group's shared efforts, but this time seemingly more than ever. As Stoic writes more chapters of its frozen landscapes, I am deeply honored to continue sharing this talented group of musicians with the world.

#### A Note From Stoic Studio

It was a driving desire to simply make art that moved us to abandon our old lives, pack up our families and set out on the adventure to build *The Banner Saga*. As everyone knows the beginning is a very delicate time and it was in this season that a generous soul offered us the best advice of all. "Out of every composer in the world, who would you most like to work with? Reach out to them." We sent the email of course believing it was a long shot. The next morning we received a phone call from an excited, approachable and always humble Austin Wintory. Over the course of the next two years of production he would evolve in our minds from brilliant composer to part of the team to friend.

Music in games is no easy matter and we're just recently seeing the next evolution of the experience. Dynamically changing cues based on the players rhythm and choice, not predefined. Unlike in film where the score is designed to work with each scene in a preselected pattern a score in a game needs to be modifiable and ever changing to support a player driven experience. When done well the player notices that actions taken evoke a new direction in the music. When done best they notice nothing but a subtle subconscious tug towards an invoked emotion.

The musical score herein reflects not only the underpinning mood of the game but also the soul of the story. Simple farmers driven from their homes as their village burns. Reluctant warriors joining the field of battle to fight a war they wish had never come. Loved ones passing into an afterlife that is full of questions, after all their gods are dead.

If the only purpose of *The Banner Saga* was to bring forth this new, moving piece of music that did not previously exist, then the whole endeavor was well worth the effort. This is art.
